Take your sailing skills to the next level with our ISSA Yacht Crew course. In just 7 courses (takes about 2-3 days), you'll gain the knowledge and hands-on experience needed to become a confident, capable, and safety-aware crew member.

Whether you're a beginner or looking to build a strong foundation for future skipper training, this course is designed to get you fully prepared to assist onboard and understand the dynamics of sailing.

- No prior certification required
- Minimum age: 10 years old

This is a certified program, meaning you are eligible for an international certificate upon successful completion.

However, you may choose to skip requesting the certificate if you plan to **continue with the Inshore Skipper program.** In that case, this program will be fully credited toward your skipper training.

COURSE #1: YACHT CONSTRUCTION AND SYSTEMS OPERATION

Module #1: Understanding the Basic Parts of a Yacht

The student knows the main parts of a yacht and their purpose:

- Cockpit Central outdoor area where steering and main controls are located.
- Bilge The lowest part of the yacht's interior, where water collects.
- Heads Marine toilet facilities.
- Galley The yacht's kitchen area.
- Bow The front section of the yacht.
- Stern / Aft The rear part of the yacht.
- Boom The horizontal spar extending from the mast, supporting the foot of the sail.
- Mast The vertical spar supporting the sails and rigging.
- Rigging The system of ropes, cables, or chains that support the mast and control the sails.
- Halyards Ropes used to hoist and lower the sails.

Module #2: Operating Elementary Yacht Systems

The student can operate basic onboard systems:

- Toilet (Heads) Understanding flushing mechanisms and best practices.
- Gas Oven Safe operation and ignition procedures.
- Sink Proper use of the water supply system.
- Shower Managing limited freshwater use effectively.

Module #3: Managing Yacht Supplies

- Refill freshwater tanks.
- Refill diesel tanks safely and correctly.

Module #4: Operating the Inboard Engine

The student is able to:

- Start the engine properly.
- Shut down the engine safely.
- Check if the cooling system is working (e.g., observing water outlet flow).
- Perform basic pre-start inspection, including:
 - a. Checking oil levels,
 - b. Verifying fuel levels,
 - c. Inspecting belts, cooling water intake, and general engine condition.

COURSE #2: LINE AND SPRING HANDLING

Module #1: Line Connection Skills

The student can: Join two lines of the same or different diameter securely.

Module #2: Essential Knot Tying and Line Management

The student can:

- Tie a bowline correctly.
- Fasten a line to a cleat securely.
- Tie a fisherman's bend (anchor hitch).
- Coil and properly stow mooring lines.

Module #3: Mooring Line Operations

- Hand over mooring lines safely to shore or other crew members.
- Receive mooring lines from shore or crew.
- Make fast mooring lines to a cleat securely.
- Let go (release) mooring lines correctly when departing.

Module #4: Understanding Mooring Techniques

The student can:

- Describe different methods of taking a mooring, including:
- Mooring alongside (alongside berthing),
- Picking up a mooring buoy,
- Mediterranean (stern-to) mooring,
- Using springs (fore and aft lines) to control yacht movement.

COURSE #3: HANDLING SAIL SHEETS AND HALYARDS

The student can:

- Set and lower the sails.
- Reef the sails and shake out the reefs effectively.

COURSE #4: HANDLING FENDERS

The student can:

- Properly fix fenders using appropriate knots.
- Effectively operate and position a maneuvering fender during docking or close-quarters handling.

COURSE #5: OPERATING THE ANCHOR

- Prepare the anchor and associated systems for use (including operating switches and controls).
- Operate the windlass, managing both letting out and retrieving the anchor chain.

COURSE #6: OPERATING THE DINGHY

The student can:

- Launch the dinghy from the deck and retrieve it back onboard.
- Secure the dinghy to the yacht when afloat and when on deck.
- Use paddles efficiently for maneuvering.
- Properly stow and lash the dinghy to the deck.

COURSE #7: SAFETY PROCEDURES

The student can:

- Move safely around the deck under various conditions.
- Use onboard safety equipment appropriately (lifejackets, harnesses, tethers, etc.).
- Operate distress signaling equipment (e.g., pyrotechnics, mirrors, signal flags, etc.).
- Use firefighting equipment correctly, including different types of fire extinguishers and fire blankets.
- Apply at least four different methods to make a distress signal.

OTHER ESSENTIAL SKILLS

- Maintain a proper lookout and report the bearing and distance to observed objects.
- Recognize the yacht's navigation lights at night.
- Make appropriate sound signals in fog conditions.
- Steer the yacht effectively and maintain a steady course while holding the helm.
